The majority of violent crimes and homicides are committed by people who do not have mental health problems. People with mental health problems are more dangerous to themselves than they are to others: 90 per cent of people who die through suicide in the UK are experiencing mental distress.

Science has long recognized the link between mental illness and crime. One mental condition that is often associated with violent crime is called "temporary insanity." It refers to a temporary condition when a person is not responsible for his or her own actions. Though these people are not insane, it is thought that during the time the crime was committed, true mental impairment existed.

### What is the Connection Between Mental Illness and Crime?

The Supreme Court emphasised that one of the most important parts of awarding a death sentence is creating deterrence against the crime. However, this goal of deterrence is neither strengthened nor diminished when a convict suffering from mental illness is put to the sword. Thus, the goal of his punishment loses its meaning.
